

## Minutes January 28, 2020

The City of Langdon place held its regular monthly meeting at the John Knox Presbyterian Church.

Mayor Mike Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Mike Frank, Commissioners Aaron Hardy, Kenny Bauer, Charlie O'Bryan, Scott Scinta, Attorney Stan Chauvin III and City Clerk/Treasurer Theresa O'Bryan.

The minutes from the December meeting were read. Council member Kenny Bauer made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Council member Scott Scinta seconded the motion. It passed in favor of accepting the minutes 5/0.

Mayor Frank suggested to begin each meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Other Council Members agreed with the proposal. Council member Scott Scinta will bring a flag to the future meetings.

Mayor Frank informed the council that Integrity Landscaping will begin mulching trees in mid-March.

The US Census Bureau sent a copy of the legal boundaries of our city for verification. Attorney Chauvin will report back how to handle the discrepancy on the map.

Council member Kenny Bauer has been working closely with Louisville Mero Government on the police patrol in the city to develop the best plans for our city security and safety. Kenny also wants to keep close watch on the water bills at the entrance to make sure there are no more underground leaks.

Council member Scott Scinta reported that the website has been updated

Council member Aaron Hardy reported that all the lights on the entrance walls are currently working properly. He also suggested that the Goose Creek entrance walls could be modernized with painting and new lights. The council requested he put together a plan and cost and present to the council in the next months.

Council member Hardy will be the first contact with the snow removal company when making decisions on any snow removal needed in the next months.

Precision Concrete Cutting contacted council member Charlie O'Bryan to see if the city had any plans on more sidewalk repairs. He informed them the city had not planned on any repairs in the current year's budget until July 2020. He also informed the council that the Christmas lights surplus was dwindling down. We may need to purchase new ones in the next year or two.

Finance Report: The monthly bill report was presented to the council for review. Council member Scinta made a motion to approve the bills and council member Bauer seconded it. It passed 5/0 in favor. The audit report was presented to the council. Attorney Chauvin identified the necessary pages that need to be included for publication in the next newsletter.
