

Minutes April 27, 2021

The City of Langdon place held its regular monthly meeting at the John Knox Presbyterian Church.

Mayor Mike Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Mike Frank, Commissioners Kenny Bauer, Charlie O'Bryan, Scott Scinta, Aaron Hardy and Attorney Stan Chauvin III and City Clerk/Treasurer Theresa O'Bryan.

Mayor Mike Frank began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes from the March meeting were read. Council member Scott Scinta made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Council member Charlie O'Bryan seconded the motion. It passed in favor of accepting the minutes 5 /0.

Greg Alvey from Ecotech introduced himself to the council. He wanted the council know that we could call at any time about sanitation issues, and he would take care of any concerns that the city has. He indicated that he would be glad to host the visit for anyone wanting a tour of the facilities. Greg will provide a flyer about recycle communication that can be put on the website as well as copied for the newsletter.

Mayor Mike Frank informed the council that Duggins replaced a vandalized stop sign in the neighborhood.

The city-wide yard sale is set for June 12<sup>th</sup>. It was suggested to place an ad in the printed version of the Courier Journal as well as the Langdon Place website with the details of the upcoming yard sale.

Mayor Frank provided the council with the Podges proposal cost for placing mulch on the trees in the city easements. The council requested that the Mayor seek an addition quote to have a comparison.

The Covid 19 fund guidelines for the municipal cities will be available in the next month. Mayor Frank will be checking with JCLC about the information.

Council member Scott Scinta reported that the newsletter will go out next week.

Council member O'Bryan reported that the lock at the storage unit had been broken into. He said that the storage company replaced the lock and that nothing was reported missing.

City Clerk Theresa O'Bryan put in a request that the August meeting be changed from Aug 24<sup>th</sup> to Aug 31<sup>st</sup>. The council agreed to the change.

Finance Report: The monthly bill report was presented to the Council for review. Council member Aaron Hardy made a motion to approve the bills and council member Kenny Bauer seconded it. It passed in favor 5/0.
