

Minutes June 22, 2021

The City of Langdon place held its regular monthly meeting at the John Knox Presbyterian Church.

Mayor Mike Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Mike Frank, Commissioners Kenny Bauer, Charlie O'Bryan, Scott Scinta, Aaron Hardy and Attorney Stan Chauvin III and City Clerk/Treasurer Theresa O'Bryan.

Absent from the meeting: None

Guests attending the meeting: Leigh Ann Lyles

Mike Frank began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes from the May meeting were read. Council member Scott Scinta made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Council member Charlie O'Bryan seconded the motion. It passed in favor of accepting the minutes 5/0.

Leigh Ann Lyles presented several proposals to the Council for ways to improve the website for the city. She uses HOA-MyNetwWire Hosted services. Two suggestions she presented were to have a resident login and a Wikipedia page. She will get back with the Council in several months with a proposal and more suggestions for improving the sight.

Mayor Frank informed the Council that Podges will be mulching the city trees beginning June 28th. Mayor Frank is also getting Louisville Tree Service and Tree Care, Inc. to submit a proposal for trimming trees.

Mayor Frank informed the Council that the first check from the American Rescue Plan Act funds should be mailed to the City by the end of July.

Council Member Aaron Hardy wanted to know if Podges would be weeding and edging the trees before they mulch. Mayor Frank informed Aaron that they would be providing those services before mulching.

Council Member Hardy thought that a mobile vaccine unit in the city for a day would be a great idea.

He also questioned if the ARPA guidelines would allow for Council members to purchase computers for their city work. Mayor Frank will follow up on this.

Council Member Scott Scinta informed the Council that the website is updated. He also informed the Council that several stop signs were faded. They are located at Blossom/Wareham and Titleist/Blossom. Mayor Frank will contact Duggins to replace them.

Council Member Kenny Bauer suggest that the city look into repairing sidewalks. Council Member O'Bryan said he would walk the sidewalks and report back to the city next month of sidewalks that are in need of repair.

Attorney Chauvin told the council that the Graymoor-Devondale Police would like to contract with our city for Police protection. It was suggested to have a police officer from that group attend a meeting so the Council could ask questions and be better informed in order to make a decision on whether to switch or to stay with the current Jefferson County Police for our police protection. LMPD are down 220 police officers which makes it difficult to hire police for security purposes.

Attorney Chauvin has submitted all documentation needed to resolve the annex issue. The ball is now in their court.

Attorney Chauvin informed the city on the status of the ongoing court case for resident parking violations. The next hearing is scheduled in October.

Finance Report: The council had the second reading of ordinance 1, series 2021 and Ordinance 2, series 2021. Council member Charlie O'Bryan made a motion to accept ordinance 1, series 2021 and council member Kenny Bauer seconded it. It passed in favor 5/0. Council member Scott Scinta made a motion to accept ordinance 2, series 2021 and council member Kenny Bauer seconded it. It passed in favor 5/0.

The monthly bill report was presented to the Council for review. Council member Aaron Hardy made a motion to approve the bills and council member Kenny Bauer seconded it. It passed in favor 5/0.

The next meeting will be July 27, 2021 at 7:00pm.

There was no further business: Mayor Mike Frank adjourned the meeting at 8:40pm.
