

Minutes May 25, 2021

The City of Langdon place held its regular monthly meeting at the John Knox Presbyterian Church.

Mayor Mike Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Mike Frank, Commissioners Kenny Bauer, Charlie O'Bryan, Scott Scinta, and Attorney Stan Chauvin III and City Clerk/Treasurer Theresa O'Bryan.

Absent from the meeting: Aaron Hardy

Guests attending the meeting: None

Mayor Mike Frank began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes from the April meeting were read. Council member Scott Scinta made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Council member Charlie O'Bryan seconded the motion. It passed in favor of accepting the minutes 4/0.

Mayor Frank presented the council with several suggestions for spending of the anticipated funds from the American Rescue Plan. They are as follows:

1. Website improvements
2. Electronics to improve communication
3. LED street lights
4. AT&T dark fiber
5. Mobil Vaccine unit in the city

The applications for the necessary forms to qualify to receive the funds will need to be submitted. A DUNS # and SAM# will also need to be applied for.

Mayor Frank informed the Council that Podges will be mulching the city trees beginning next week.

Council Member Kenny Bauer also noted that there was a tripping hazard on Koster Place sidewalk.

Council member Scott Scinta is working to overhaul and modernize the Langdon Place Website. He plans to invite LeAnn the designer of the web site to a meeting to get input from the Council. Scott also will place yard sale signs out the week before the sale date.

Council member Kenny Bauer has three new work orders with MSD. He stated that the basins need to be cleaned out again.

Attorney Chauvin told the council that the Graymoor-Devondale Police would like to contract with our city for Police protection. Their rate would be \$56/hour. It was suggested to have a police officer from that group attend a meeting so the Council could ask questions and be better informed in order to make a decision on whether to switch or to stay with the current Jefferson County Police for our police protection.

Finance Report: The council had the first reading of ordinance 1, series 2021 and Ordinance 2, series 2021.

The monthly bill report was presented to the Council for review. Council member Charlie O'Bryan made a motion to approve the bills and council member Scott Scinta seconded it. It passed in favor 4/0.

The next meeting will be June 22, 2021 at 7:00pm.

There was no further business: Mayor Mike Frank adjourned the meeting at 7:45pm.
