

Minutes April 22, 2022

The City of Langdon place held its regular monthly meeting at the John Knox Presbyterian Church. Mayor Mike Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Mike Frank, Council members Kenny Bauer, Scott Scinta, Nathan Bellows, Charlie O'Bryan, Attorney Stan Chauvin III and City Clerk/Treasurer Theresa O'Bryan.

Absent from the meeting: None

Guests attending the meeting: Yolanda Demaree, Kent Hall (Candidate for Metro Council District 17) and Pamela Linville

Mayor Frank began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes from the March meeting were read. Council member Scott Scinta made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Council member Nathan Bellows seconded the motion. It passed in favor of accepting the minutes 5/0.

Resident Pamela Linville expressed her concern about the crime in the neighborhood. She had suggested viewing neighbor's security cameras in the event of a crime.

Metro Council candidate Kent Hall visited with the council and informed the council of his views.

RSA advisors have assisted in the reporting documents for the April 30th deadline of the ARPA reports.

Mayor Frank suggested projects that could be funded through the ARPA funds. He will be addressing these with RSA advisors to determine if the projects would qualify for the funding. The projects are as follows:

- Road repairs and resurfacing
- Add sufficient electronic equipment to assist in the Pandemic
- Dark fiber cable to assist residents working in home offices
- Improve lighting in low lit areas to assist residents who walk
- Security cameras in areas to assist in crime resolution
- Donations to groups that service our city that were financially hit by the Pandemic

Mayor Frank informed the council that LG&E trimmed the trees affecting the lines on Langdon Dr and fixed the light that was out in that area.

Large Item pickup will be Saturday May 14. All upholstered furniture needs to be wrapped in plastic.

The second reading for the second time was made for Parking Ordinance 1, 2022 stating that it is unlawful to park a motor vehicle, auto, tractor etc. on the north side of Blossom Lane from cross street Langdon Drive to 150 feet to the west. Council Member Scott Scinta made a motion to accept the Ordinance as read. Council Member O'Bryan seconded the motion. It passed 5/0 in acceptance.

Council member Nathan Bellows made a motion to paint the curb yellow and place “no parking” signs up. Council Member Charlie O’Bryan seconded the motion. It passed 5/0 in acceptance. Council Member Kenny Bauer will take care of the logistics of the paint and signs.

Council Member O’Bryan indicated that an area of sidewalk on 9008 Blossom Lane needs raising to eliminate pooling water. He will get a quote to have that raised.

Council Member O’Bryan also talked about the possibility of installing a security camera systems at all entrances to the city with the ARPA funds and the initial and yearly maintenance cost.

Council Member O’Bryan reviewed the neighborhood mailboxes and indicated that there was no immediate need for any replacements or repairs.

Council Member O’Bryan had received a call from a concerned neighbor that the drainage ditch between Kennersley Drive and Hyannis Place needed cleaning. O’Bryan contacted David Tapp to clean out the ditch with Mayor Frank’s approval.

Council Member Bauer reported that he has not heard back from MSD on any of the open orders.

Council Member Bauer reported an abandoned vehicle in the neighborhood. He will be informing Ordinance Officer David Mudd on this issue.

Council Member Scott Scinta reported that Lawnco has turned on the water at each of the entranceways on March 20th

Council member Scott Scinta also reported that the website has been updated.

The June Meeting will be scheduled for June 14th instead of the 4th Tuesday of the month June 28th due to scheduling issues of several Council Members.

LMPD resource officer David Hamlin has been invited to attend the May 24 meeting.

The Council member and Mayor elections are this November. The deadline for signing up to be listed on the ballot is June 7th.

The Citywide Yard Sale date is scheduled for May 21st

Finance Report: The monthly bill report was presented to the Council for review. Council member Scott Scinta made a motion to approve the bills and council member Charlie O’Bryan seconded it. It passed in favor of acceptance 5/0.

The next meeting will be May 24, 2022 at 7:00pm.

There was no further business and Mayor Frank adjourned the meeting at 8:50pm.
